Program Notes

Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924) was a French composer, organist, pianist, and teacher. He is widely regarded as one of the most influential French composers, bridging the Romantic era to the modernism of the 20th century. He is widely seen as the master of the French art song, or *mélodie*, having composed over 100 examples of the genre. At a young age, Fauré was tutored by the composer Camille Saint-Saëns, who became a close life-long friend. He served for many years as choirmaster and organist of various churches in France and Switzerland, all the while building his reputation as a composer. In 1896, Fauré was appointed as professor of composition at the Paris Conservatoire, a controversial move, given that the institution's conservative faculty felt that Fauré was dangerously modern. Fauré was known for encouraging the unique compositional voices of his students, including Maurice Ravel, Georges Enescu, and Nadia Boulanger. Boulanger taught the American composer Aaron Copland, who later befriended Leonard Bernstein. Although he never taught Bernstein officially, Bernstein referred to Copland as his "only real composition teacher." A common focus of all these composers and teachers, from Fauré through Boulanger, Copland, and Bernstein, is "the long musical line."

Fauré began composing his *Requiem* in 1887, and it was performed in its first version on January 16th, 1888 at the Church of the Madeleine in Paris, where Fauré was employed as principal organist. Its original version included just five movements, but was expanded in 1893 to include the *Offertory* and the *Libera me*, both of which call for a baritone soloist. The original orchestration calls for divided violas and cellos with no violins, echoing the opening movement of Brahms' *Ein Deutsches Requiem*. The work was reorchestrated for full orchestra, a task which the composer and editor John Rutter (whose edition we are singing from today) believes may have been undertaken by one of Fauré's students, given the composer's busy schedule and the hundreds of misprints in the published score. Our performance today reflects the 1893 version of the Requiem.

The Requiem is one of Fauré's most famous and frequently performed works. It opens with a somber statement of the Requiem text, and moves to solos from the tenor and soprano sections before the choir returns with music that rapidly changes dynamics (loud and soft). This opening movement establishes two tendencies that persist throughout the Requiem: highlighting individual voice parts within the choir, and rapid shifts from loud to soft. In the Offertory, Fauré heavily features the altos and tenors, whose haunting duet contemplates the deliverance of the souls of the dead from the dark pit of hell; the sopranos and tenors/basses duet in the heavenly Sanctus; the tenors carry the opening of the Agnus Dei; and the sopranos present a musical depiction of heaven in the closing In Paradisum.

Program Notes

Leonard Bernstein (1918-1990) is one of the most important American musical figures of the 20th century. Born of Ukrainian-Jewish parents in Lawrence, Massachusetts, his best-known work is the musical West Side Story. Bernstein's legacy is an eclectic mix of his roles as conductor, composer, educator, and activist. He was music director of the New York Philharmonic from 1957-1969, after which he was designated Conductor Laureate, conducting performances with the ensemble until his death in 1990, including on State Department-funded international tours in Latin America and behind the Iron Curtain. He composed concert works such as *Chichester Psalms* and the *Kaddish Symphony*, as well as theater works including *Candide*, *On The Waterfront*, and later, his *MASS*. He taught numerous conductors, including Marin Alsop and Seiji Ozawa. Through his 1958-1972 series *Young People's Concerts* on CBS, Bernstein educated a generation of young Americans in classical music. Throughout his career, Bernstein was outspoken on many causes, including nuclear disarmament and financial support for members of the Black Panther Party.

Do not be mistaken by the title of Bernstein's *MASS*. It is not a mass like Fauré's Requiem mass, but rather, a large-scale staged work officially entitled: *MASS: A Theatre Piece for Singers, Players, and Dancers*. Jaqueline Kennedy Onassis asked Bernstein to compose music for the 1971 opening of the John F. Kennedy Center for Performing Arts in Washington, DC, and Bernstein obliged, commenting that he always wanted "to compose a service of one sort or another." In his MASS, Bernstein places the Roman Catholic liturgy in dialogue with music and lyrics in the popular idioms of the 20th century, reflecting the turmoil, conflict, and crisis in the era after Kennedy's assassination. In that sense, Bernstein's *MASS* takes a Jewish approach to the Catholic liturgy, embodying the foundational Jewish principle of struggling or wrestling with God.

Today, we are performing just a small selection of music from Bernstein's *MASS*. We begin with the most commonly excerpted movement from the work, the beautiful "A Simple Song" for tenor. In the staged version, the "Alleluia" is pre-recorded, and the "Almighty Father" is sung by the congregation. We skip forward to the Gloria, which encompasses the "Gloria Tibi" in 5/8 time, followed by the West Side Story-like music of "Gloria in Excelsis Deo," which is followed by an answer by the "street chorus" of disaffected youths in the staged version (here sung by the full Chorale), singing the timely "Half of the People." The Sanctus uses text in Latin, English, and Hebrew, all reflecting the same Sanctus text that we heard in the Fauré Requiem, which has its origins in the Hebrew "Kadosh, kadosh," In the Agnus Dei, the congregation and "street chorus" become increasingly distressed as they demand peace ("dona nobis pacem"). The final movement of *MASS* is "Secret Songs," an elaboration on "A Simple Song" that we heard at the beginning, which starts with soloists and grows to include the entire chorus and orchestra. *MASS* closes with a simple, unaccompanied repeat of the chorale, "Almighty Father."

Meet Cape Fear Chorale's New Personnel



Aaron Peisner is delighted to conduct Cape Fear Chorale in his first concert as Artistic Director. He is Director of Choral Activities and Assistant Professor of Music at University of North Carolina Wilmington, where he conducts the Chamber Choir, Concert Choir, and Opera Workshop, and teaches courses in choral methods, aural skills, conducting, and voice. He has prepared choirs for performances with the Baltimore and National Symphony Orchestras under conductors including Marin Alsop, Gianandrea Noseda, Donald Runnicles, and Jeannette Sorrell. He previously served as Interim Director of Choirs at Goucher College in Towson, MD.

Dr. Peisner is chorus master for Opera Wilmington, where he prepared the chorus for the production of Mozart's *The Magic Flute* in the summer of 2022 and will prepare the chorus for the upcoming production of Verdi's *La Traviata*. He served as chorus master for the Maryland Opera Studio's productions of Mozart's *La clemenza di Tito* and Poulenc's *Dialogues des Carmélites*.

A bass-baritone, Dr. Peisner has sung professionally with the Choir of the Basilica of the National Shrine in Washington, DC, the San Francisco Choral Artists, Polyhymnia (NYC), and Yale Schola Cantorum.

Dr. Peisner's research areas include the performance and recording history of Spanish Renaissance music, Kurt Weill's *Das Berliner Requiem* for men's chorus and wind band, critical pedagogy and the music leadership practices of collegiate a cappella groups, and practice techniques for conductors. He is a member of American Choral Directors Association, and recently served as co-chair for the inaugural Collegiate Festival Choir at the 2022 North Carolina state conference at Duke Chapel, bringing together over 130 collegiate singers from around the state.

He holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in choral conducting from the University of Maryland, a Master of Music in choral conducting from the Yale School of Music, and a Bachelor of Arts in music from Wesleyan University.



Bettsy Curtis holds three degrees in piano performance, a Bachelor of Music from Southern Methodist University, a Master of Music from the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati, and the Doctor of Musical Arts from The University of Texas at Austin.

Dr. Curtis started teaching piano as a graduate assistant at the University of Cincinnati, followed by the University of Texas at Austin. Full-time professor positions ensued at Baylor University, Howard Payne University, and the University of Texas at San Antonio.

She has two grown children, Holly & Wesley. When they were young, she returned to college to become certified in public school music

teaching. After ten years of public-school teaching, she served sixteen years as the Director of Music at Wesley Memorial United Methodist Church in Wilmington. Dr. Curtis now divides her time between CFCC and UNCW where she serves as a collaborative pianist.

- If you are 72 years or older, your QCD's count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD), but are not included in your taxable income.
- QCD's have so many benefits, including reducing your adjusted gross income (AGI), which may prevent an increase in Social Security taxation and Medicare premiums.
- There are a host of other benefits and some specific limitations, so talk to your tax adviser about how to use QCD's to support charitable organizations, like Cape Fear Chorale.
