Mother, lead us towards the light. When in death's embrace we languish and you hear our anxious crying and you see our mortal anguish, let not, Mother, then, the foe defeat us. Send thy loving strength to meet us. Oh, then prove thyself, our mother, and commend us to thy Son, O Mother!
